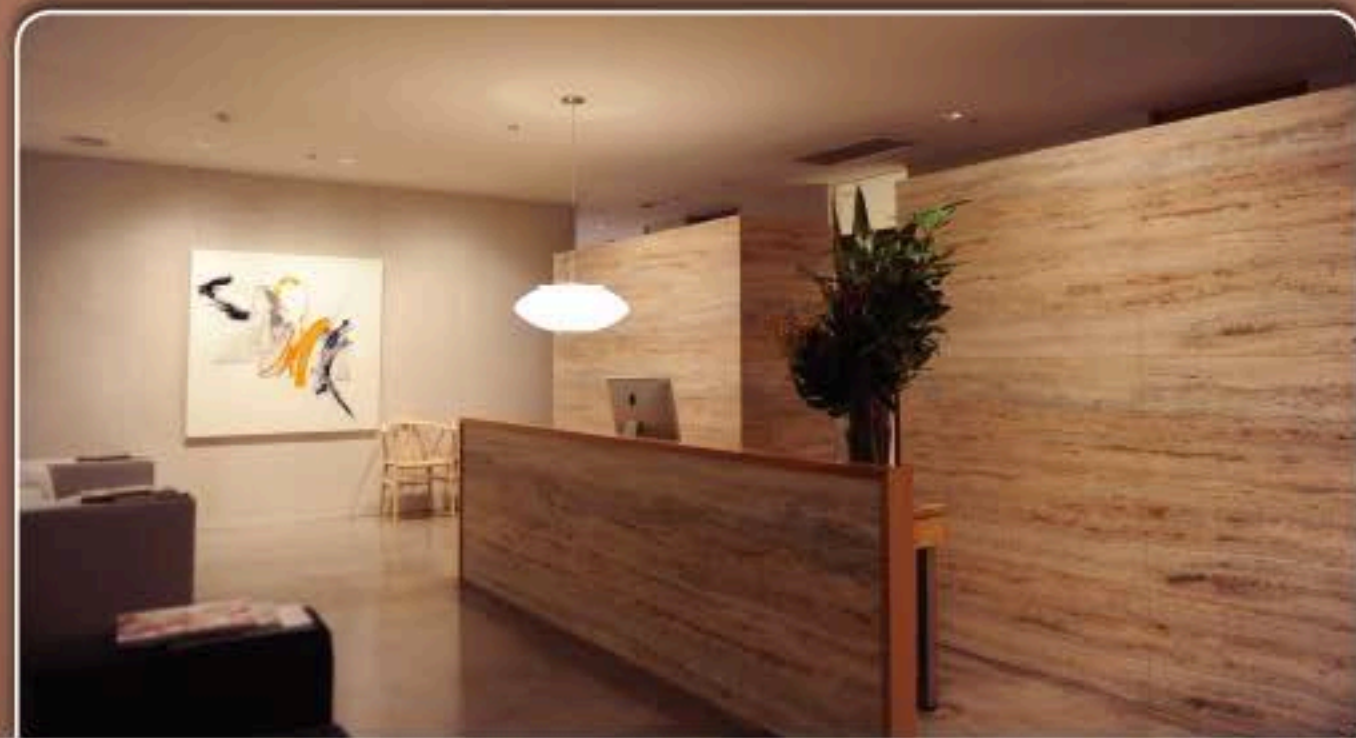


Collins Plastic Surgery

Recent interest regarding prophylactic mastectomy generated by the publicity surrounding Angelina Jolie has led to an increase in the number of women seeking genetic testing and breast reconstruction. With their experience in managing breast cancer, Mansoor and Michael have utilised their expertise to facilitate reconstruction when such women are contemplating the difficult decision of prophylactic mastectomy.

Dr Mansoor Mirkazemi is a fully qualified Australian Plastic Surgeon who specialises in cosmetic and plastic surgery.

He graduated from the University of Tasmania in 1995, moved to Victoria in 2002 to undertake two years of advanced training in General Surgery followed by an extra four years in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery under the auspices of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

He has performed hundreds of operations in breast augmentation, nasal refinement, facial aesthetic and body contouring, including breast reduction and lift and abdominoplasty. He works closely with breast cancer surgeons in public and private hospitals to reconstruct breasts following mastectomy.

Mansoor is actively involved in teaching of plastic surgery trainees and travels to a remote island in Indonesia every year as an Interplast volunteer to treat children with cleft lips and palates, burn contractures, hand injuries and tumours.
